The Application

Application for a theatre school scholarship consists of the application form, documentation of financial need, and an essay from the potential student.

Application Essays

Please attach a response to the following questions. All responses should be typed or printed clearly.

These responses should be, essentially, the work of the student himself or herself. Parents may assist younger students (grades one through four) in formulating written responses.

- 1) Why do you want to attend Civic Theatre School?
- 2) What do you think you'll get from the program?

Financial Information

Parents/Guardians: Please attach a copy of your most recent IRS 1040 tax return form. If you wish, you may attach a written explanation of your current financial situation.

Scholarship Student Responsibilities

Scholarship students will be expected to attend all classes, except in cases of illness, emergency, or other unexpected circumstances. A scholarship may be withdrawn if the recipient does not attend regularly.

Civic Theatre reserves the right to determine eligibility requirements, with respect to financial need and other criteria. Recipients may re-apply for a scholarship for subsequent Theatre School terms.
